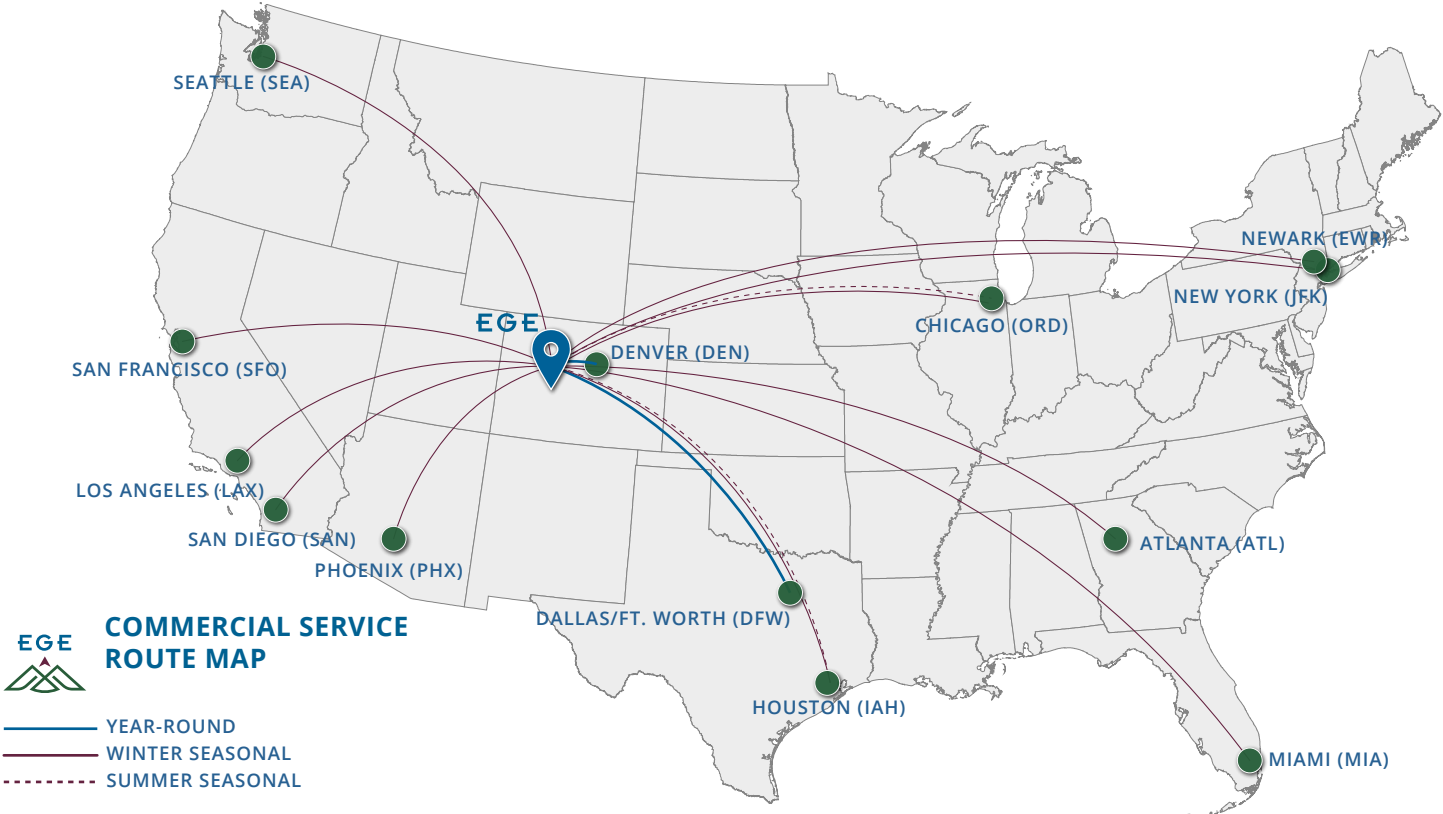


CONNECTING EAGLE COUNTY TO THE WORLD

With modern facilities that include a commercial service runway, an air traffic control tower, enhanced commercial air service terminal and passenger amenities, world-class general aviation accommodations, and a future Federal Inspection Service (FIS) facility to facilitate international flights, EGE ensures an expansive and seamless air travel experience.

KEY AIRPORT FACTS

- RUNWAY:** Runway 7-25 9,000’ x 150’, Asphalt (Expandable to 10,000’), Asphalt
- APPROACHES:** ATCT; Precision Instrument Landing System (ILS); Non-precision with vertical guidance
- TERMINAL BUILDING:** 126,000 square feet, 7 gates, and 4 jet bridges; over 1,800 total parking spots
- COMMERCIAL AIR SERVICE:** Served by 4 airlines to 13 nonstop destinations (year-round and seasonal) *See graphic above.*
- GENERAL AVIATION:** 39,000 square foot terminal; nearly 400,000 square feet of hangar area; over 85 based aircraft; Fixed Base Operator: Signature Aviation

INTRODUCTION

Eagle County Regional Airport (EGE) encompasses over 630 acres located in Eagle County and the Town of Gypsum within the Vail Valley, an area renowned for its proximity to world-class ski resorts like Vail and Beaver Creek, as well as its stunning Rocky Mountain scenery and outdoor recreational opportunities. The Airport connects the region to the world by providing facilities to accommodate commercial air service, air cargo, and general aviation operations, as well as supporting high altitude helicopter training for U.S. and international military defense. Owned and operated by Eagle County, EGE is a critically important point of access to and from the region, serving as the cornerstone of the regional economy. In 2025, the Airport completed an Airport Master Plan designed to continue the vision for future EGE development to meet the long-term aviation demands of the County, the Town, and the Vail Valley.

As an integral part of Eagle County, EGE provides ease of access to both commercial and general aviation air travel, career opportunities, and well-paying jobs for the community. With over 285,000 passenger boardings and 58,000 aircraft takeoffs and landings each year, EGE is the premier gateway for the Rocky Mountain region.

In concert with Eagle County efforts, EGE and its users are committed to energy conservation and resilience today and tomorrow. Electrification, net zero carbon reduction goals, sustainable aviation fuels, microgrid development, energy efficient new construction are just a sampling of existing efforts, with more to come!



ECONOMIC IMPACT
EGE's economic impact supports over 7,000 jobs with a total of nearly \$270 million in payroll generating over \$783 million in economic activity for the local community and region every year. That is an annual return which is over 150 times the average annual capital investment made in EGE!



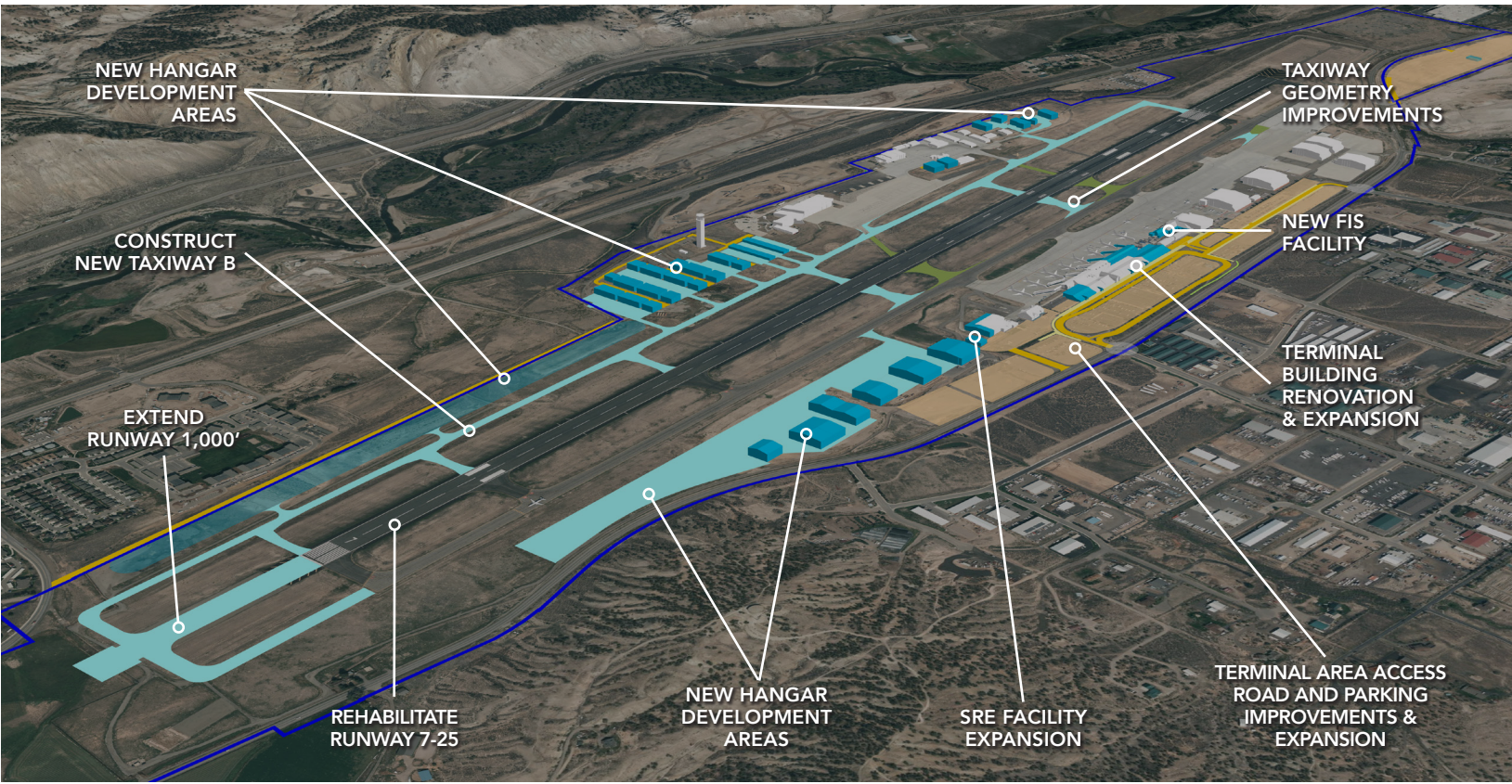
EAGLE COUNTY'S HUB OF AVIATION
EGE is currently served by 4 domestic commercial airlines to 13 nonstop destinations (year-round and seasonal) with new international destinations projected in the future. General aviation activities directly connect EGE with over 1,000 national and 120 international airports every year (see below). EGE serves the region as a emergency response resource as well as the High Altitude Army National Guard (ARNG) Aviation Training Site (HAATS) for helicopter training within the U.S.

IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

Over the next 20 years and beyond, development at EGE is expected to reach new levels in efficiency, convenience, and economic opportunity for the businesses and individuals that use the Airport. EGE's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) is divided into three phases: Phase 1 (short-term, 2024-2028), Phase 2 (intermediate term, 2029-2033), and Phase 3 (long-term, 2034-2043) that includes an Ultimate condition (beyond 20 years). The CIP prioritizes master plan recommendations and maintenance with costs being shared among various stakeholders (Eagle County, FAA, CDOT, private developers, tenants, and others) based on federal and state funding eligibility requirements.
